
CENSUS PROFILE Johnson County, Kansas

In 2020, Johnson County, Kansas, remained the second most populous county in the nine-county MARC Region with 609,863 persons, which also makes it the largest county in the state of Kansas. Representing 29% of the region's total population, Johnson County grew by 12 percent from 2010. The county consistently exhibits strong growth, generating a population that is up nearly 325% since 1960.


Johnson County added 65,684 persons during the decade, the most of any county in the region. This was due to a natural increase (births over deaths) of 33,207 residents and a net inmigration of 32,477 persons.


Population change by race and ethnicity mirrors the region's trend with most (78%) of the county's growth due to increases in persons of color. Persons of color saw their share of the county's population increase from approximately 22% in 2010 to approximately 25% in 2020.

The largest increases in population by race and ethnicity were experienced by individuals who identified as two or more races, Hispanic, white alone, and Asian and Pacific Islander alone.




Components of Population Change, 2010–2020






Population Change, 2010-2020
