

Free Gas Cap Testing

Don't Let Your Gasoline Evaporate

In honor of Air Quality Week, May 1-7, KCATA and Mid-America Regional Council are offering to test gas caps for Park-and-Ride customers so you can find out if your gas cap should be replaced. Follow the instructions on the back of this card if you would like to have this voluntary, free test performed on your gas cap.

More than half of the ozone pollution in the Kansas City region comes from the use of gasoline-fueled cars and trucks. **A gas cap that doesn't seal properly can leak as much as 30 gallons of gasoline over the course of a year!** That can cost you money and contributes to air pollution. Gas caps can fail on any vehicle, new or old.

To get your gas cap tested on Thursday, May 5, see the reverse side.

TESTING INSTRUCTIONS

If you would like to have KCATA and Mid-America Regional Council test your gas cap:

- 1.) Place this card under your windshield wiper.
- 2.) Unlock/open the door to your gas cap. (We need to have access to the cap to test it.)

We will conduct tests at this Metro Park-and-Ride on the morning of Thursday, May 5, and will share the results with you on this card.

If your gas cap fails, we'll leave you a coupon for 20% off the cost of a new gas cap, courtesy of NAPA Auto Parts.
