**1. Welcome and Introductions**

Larry Larimore opened the meeting. He welcomed those in attendance.  
Introductions were made.

**2. Threat Analysis Update**

**3. UASI Project Review**

Larry Larimore reported that the RHSCC Co-Chairs will meet in August to review all projects from all subcommittees using UASI funding. This subcommittee must submit a prioritized list of projects for the RHSCC Co-Chairs' review.

Erin Lynch stated all of FY 2007 funds have been exhausted. FY 2008 grant will expire in August but an extension has been requested and is expected to be granted. Some FY 2009 and 2010 funds have been spent and/or obligated but there is still substantial dollars available to be allocated for projects.

Larry Larimore asked all project leads to develop reports prioritizing all projects. He must receive these reports within two weeks for presentation to the RHSCC Co-Chairs on August 2.

#### **4. LETPA Working Group**

Keith Faddis explained that the State of Missouri has added two regions to address the needs of the urban areas of the state. Kansas City will be a part of Urban Region A. At a meeting on June 15, the LETPA Working Group voted to transfer \$200,000 from the FY2011 MoDEX funds to the Urban Region A for use towards terrorism prevention activities. The most likely use of these dollars would be to support the KC TEW personnel costs. Faddis indicated representation by a Police Chief and a Sheriff is needed on this working group from Urban Region A. The co-chairs will address that election/appointment at a later meeting.

#### **5. Financial Update on Projects**

- a. Regional Helicopter Project-MARC Board approved \$231,000 for software. The rest of the funding comes from the port security grant.
- b. TEW (TEW/APRS Combined)- Bob Kolenda reported: FY09 and 2010 UASI – Obligated (approx. \$114,000) includes personnel costs Jul 2011 to Dec 31, 2013, assumes 6 month extension each year; contracted director services; and known service fees and maintenance agreements.
- c. Alert ETAC-Tim Lynch reported: FY 2010 funding remaining of \$136,000 is not obligated at this time. Some enhancements are being reviewed. All participating agencies are responsible for sustainment.

- d. Enhanced Tactical-Tim Lynch reported: FY 2010 HSRT \$ 87,500; half each (\$43,750) to tactical teams and EOD. FY 2010 UASI \$196,200-planned expenditures include small, low level robots, ballistic shields and lights.
- e. EOD- Mark Leibig reported: FY 2010 funds of \$558, 000 are obligated for two robot upgrades. Needs are bomb suits, PPE, TCV, ECM. Planning for those purchases is ongoing.
- f. APRS (see above TEW)

**7. Other Business**

Tim Lynch made a motion to reprogram \$159,891.57 from FY 2008 UASI Tactical Team funds to purchase TCV and robots. Frank Stranimier seconded the motion. All members were in favor; none opposed. \$159,891.57 from FY 2008 UASI Tactical Team funds will be reprogrammed to purchase TCV and robots.

Frank Stranimier made a motion to reprogram \$510,000 from FY 2010 UASI funds to support the Triggerfish project presented by Kansas City, Mo. Police Department. These funds were previously allocated for the biometric project which was abandoned until more advanced technologies are developed. Tim Lynch seconded the motion. All members were in favor; none opposed. \$510,000 from FY 2010 UASI funds previously allocated for the biometric project will be reprogrammed to support the Triggerfish project.
