1. Welcome and Introductions

Tim Lynch welcomed the subcommittee and self-introductions were made.

4. Update on Regional Law Enforcement Projects

Regional Helicopter Project

Nothing new to report.

TEW

Bob Kolenda reported that Intel Operations Specialist position should be filled by mid-year.

Alert ETAC

Tim Lynch reported that during a meeting earlier that morning, the group worked to identify future needs so funding requests can be better defined and better planned for.

Enhanced Tactical

Mike Wood reported that there have been obstacles in securing federal credentials for a team and has therefore started working with both state Governors to secure an MOU and change state statutes allowing the team to cross state lines.

EOD

Mark Liebig reported that there will be a commander's meeting next Monday to discuss the next six to 12 months. Jon Tucker is working on an SOP for handling suicide bombers. Once the SOP is developed, it will be exercised to verify its effectiveness before distributing it to local police departments.

Regional Camera Project

Captain David Lindaman provided a final report on this project during the February meeting; therefore, this project will be removed from the agenda. Jurisdictions may buy off of the MARC bid and interested parties should contact Keith Faddis for more information. There is no funding programmed for this project.

APRS

Bob Kolenda reported Mike Wilson is working on the tier 1 and tier 2 data call. Several agencies have completed training on data entry and Cass County was given equipment to set up their system.

5. Training & Exercise Activities

Keith Faddis reported that RAMBIS is about to be operational and train-the-trainer sessions have already begun. He explained that the training isn't only for dispatchers but also for end users of the system. Faddis also explained that 2010 IECGP grants cannot be used to purchase equipment so the funding will be used to hire a contractor to develop interoperability training.

Jon Tucker reported that on June 10, an engineer from Black and Veatch will conduct an eight hour training on blast damage, basic explosives and building/structure collapse. Tucker noted that this training might be of useful to city and county personnel who work on infrastructure. Interested parties should contact Jon Tucker.

David Cudmore reported that the CDC and FBI will be conducting a regional tabletop training on bioterrorism and pathogens July 20-21 at the Westin - Crown Center. Law enforcement and public health disciplines will be working with epidemiology based scenarios.

Mark Owen reported on the *When Bad Guys Come to Town* session presented by the Wexford Group. The free course sponsored by the RHSCC Training and Exercise Committee will be held at the Platte County Resource Center and is limited to 80-100 participants.

Tim Lynch reported that there is a need for a law enforcement presence at the April 7 regional mass casualty table top exercise.

7. Other Business

Keith Faddis reported that the 2010 UASI budget was approved during last month's RHSCC co-chairs meeting after some cuts which did not affect the request from the law enforcement subcommittee. If another source of funding is secured for the Mobile Command Post, the \$500,000 set aside for that project can be reprogrammed.
