What can you expect from a career as a Paramedic or EMT?

You'll be making a difference...

From accidents to illnesses, people's lives often depend on the quick response and skillful care they receive from Paramedics and EMTs. As a first responder, you'll typically be dispatched to the scene by a 9-1-1 center. You'll evaluate the patient's condition, give appropriate emergency care and, when necessary, transport the patient to a medical facility.



You can be on the job quickly...

Most EMT positions require about 200 class hours of training to get started. You may be able to work as an EMT while you continue your education to earn Paramedic certification.



Your training will include classroom, field and hospital time. You'll learn general information about medical conditions, and practice skills such as taking

vital signs, assessing patients, bandaging and cardio-pulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

You'll have room to grow...

Demand is even greater for emergency medical personnel with advanced certification. With additional training, you can move up from EMT-Basic to EMT-Intermediate or Paramedic.

You'll be part of a team ...

As an EMT or Paramedic, you'll work with a team of professionals, often in life or death situations. You'll work closely with firefighters, law enforcement and other public safety or industrial personnel.

EMS agencies in the Kansas City region work together through MARCER — the Mid-America Regional Council Emergency Rescue Committee. 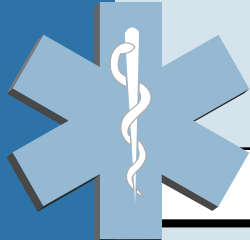


Your skills will be in demand...
