i) Jan Faidley motions to approve, Bailey Waters seconds

3) Presentation: Carbon Reduction Program - Karen Clawson

- i) The purpose is to reduce transportation CO2 emissions
- ii) A \$6 billion federal program with 65% of funds allocated for MPOs
- iii) MARC Region Programming Process:
 - Developed a small task force
 - Met three times during the fall of 2022 to define:
 - (1) The process
 - (2) Priorities
 - (3) Criteria to guide the project selection process
 - Members of the committee included representatives from TTPC, Air Quality Forum, SPPC, and Climate & Environment Council.

iv) Programming CR Funds:

- 2023 Call for projects for FY22-24 CRP funds (\$14 million)
- 20% match requirement
- Favor to implementation activities
- Effort addresses Justice40 initiatives and encourages sustainability and equity-focused projects
- Emissions calculations will be required CMAQ resources available

v) Tentative Timeline:

- March 30th: Call for projects open
- April 6th: Pre-application workshop
- May 19th: Applications due
- May-June: Staff scoring and public comments
- June-July: Workgroup deliberation
- August-October: TIP public comments & TTPC/Board Approvals

4) Presentation: Connected KC 2050 Update – Martin Rivarola

- i) An update to Connected KC 2050 is starting to be developed and will be published in 2025
- ii) Long-Range Transportation Plan:
 - Establishes regional vision
 - Develops policies and strategies
 - Identifies significant projects
 - Required of all metro areas
 - Guides spending for 25-30 years
 - Update every five years

- iii) Financing and Projects:
 - \$52B revenues and expenditures
 - 289 constrained projects at \$7.3B
 - 136 illustrative projects at \$6.9B
 - 30% more transit service
 - 3% more road capacity
- iv) Plan Update Objectives:
 - Outreach & Engagement
 - (1) Disadvantaged populations, rural groups, etc.
 - (2) Equity, Justice 40 and resilience considerations
 - Alignment & Integration
 - (1) Stronger buy-in from stakeholders
 - (2) Planned investments alignment
 - (3) Preferred investment scenario
 - (4) Climate and safety goals integration
 - Policy
 - (1) Identify workforce transportation needs/constraints
 - (2) Integrate housing considerations

5) Presentation: Flint Hill RAISE grant and community trail work in Osawatomie – Jeff Bender & Jeff Dorsett

- i) Flint Hill Trail is a rail trail that will be 118 miles long from Osawatomie, KS to Herington, KS
 - It will go through 19 communities and 11 cities
- ii) Since 2015, there have been six phases and 64 miles of trail have been completed
- iii) Next Step: Phase 7 –West of Ottawa (not RAISE project)
 - \$5.5 million in TA funding
 - 2.3 miles with new railroad bridge, three other bridges, replacing 10 pipes, and new ditching
- iv) Awarded 2022 RAISE Grant funds of \$24.8 million
 - Project scope: broken into 3 phases
 - (1) 40.5 miles of trail with surfacing, fencing, signage, and gates
 - (2) New and improved piping and drainage
 - (3) 14 bridge improvements and one bridge replacement
 - (4) 6 new trailheads
 - (5) Two highway crossings and crossing grades

6) Planning: Committee ranking of priority objectives for a Regional Counting Program and a Regional Sidewalk Inventory

7) Presentation: Regional Trails & Bikeways Map: new cartographical styles & mapping standards – Patrick Trouba

- i) Factors driving the need for map changes:
 - New types of bikeways currently not well accounted for
 - Inability to verify some data through imagery
 - Desire for harmonization between map data and guidance from professional associations

ii) Results from changes:

- New cartographical map style with new classifications
- Written guidance for what will be added and removed from map
 i) Written guidance will hopefully provide clarity and transparency, and a future update process
