Home Modifications

Modifying your home can make it better suited to your changing needs as you get older. Modifications range from simple things, such as clearing clutter, improving lighting or removing rugs to help prevent falls, to more complex changes, such as installing a stair lift or renovating a bathroom.

Repairs

Some houses may need minor repairs before they can be modified. For example, a leaky pipe will need to be fixed before a bathtub or shower can be made accessible.



Examples of home modifications*

- Add grab bars in bathroom.
- Install handheld shower heads.
- · Remove or secure rugs.
- Add nonskid strips to stairs.
- · Install handrails for staircases.
- Install nonskid flooring.
- Improve lighting.
- Build ramps or no-step entries.
- Widen doorways or halls.
- Install adjustable kitchen countertops.

Examples of home repairs*

- Restore heating/cooling.
- Fix dangerous electrical problems.
- · Repair faulty plumbing.
- Install new water heater.
- Repair rotted flooring.
- Fix water damage from flooding.
- · Update windows.

^{*} If your needed home modification or repair isn't listed above, discuss your needs with MARC to determine if your project is eligible.



Who is eligible for services and how to apply:

If you are a resident aged 60+ in Clay, Cass, Jackson, Platte or Ray counties, and are interested in home repair or modification services, follow these simple steps:

- 1. Call 816-421-4980. A MARC representative will talk with you to see if you are eligible for services.
- 2. If you're eligible, a MARCapproved, nonprofit home remodeling company will be assigned to work with you to:
 - Assess your modification and/or repair needs.
 - Develop a plan.
 - Schedule and perform modifications and/or repairs based on your assessment.
- 3. The home remodeling company will bill MARC for services. Projects will be limited in scope and cost.

Renters

On a case-by-case basis, this program is available for those who rent their homes. Call 816-421-4980, and MARC will talk with you and your landlord to see if modifications and/or repairs are possible.
