This grant will buy us:

- 15 resilience hubs.
 - Energy efficiency improvements at 600 single family homes and 15 multi-family buildings.
 - Weatherization of 12,000 homes.
 - 140 EV charging ports.
 - 47 solar arrays at resilience hubs, urban farms, nonprofits.
 - 82 low-carbon/electric vehicles.
 - 15,000 trees.
 - 600 residential native landscapes.
 - 36 orchards and 150 school and community gardens.
 - 15 miles of green streets and bike lanes.
 - 5,400 e-bikes.
 - 2-3 commercial composting sites.
