REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS

BACKGROUND

The Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) is a nonprofit association of city and county governments and the metropolitan planning organization for the Kansas City region. MARC promotes regional cooperation and develops innovative solutions while providing a forum for the region to work together to advance social, economic, and environmental progress.

The Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) is a nonprofit association of city and county governments and the metropolitan planning organization for the Kansas City region. Capitalizing on well-established community connections, MARC serves as the grantee for Head Start and Early Head Start programs in metropolitan Kansas City in Clay, Platte and Jackson Counties. These programs provide comprehensive, high quality, birth through five early education services that facilitate healthy development, including physical and social/emotional development, and prepare children for school success. Head Start and Early Head Start programs will serve approximately 2300 children and their families through contracted direct service providers throughout Clay, Platte and Jackson Counties in Missouri. Services will be provided in center-based and home visiting programs for children from birth to five years and pregnant women. Ten percent of MARC's actual enrollment must be children eligible for services under Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).

Contracted early childhood programs will fit within one of three Tiers based on each agency's capacity to provide comprehensive services. Agencies in Tiers 1 or 2 serve fewer numbers of HS/EHS children (less than 200) and receive supplemental support from MARC in meeting comprehensive requirements. MARC will support these programs in a variety of ways including contractual agreements with outside community agencies and consultants to support provision of comprehensive services including social services for children and families. It is for this reason that we are seeking a qualified individual to perform family and community activities as outlined in the scope of work below. The Family and Community Engagement Specialist will work within the MARC Head Start network of sites, and in collaboration with the MARC Family and Community Engagement Manager and other staff to provide coordinated support or Head Start and Early Head Start families. See Exhibit A for a list of all sites.

MARC is seeking individuals who have experience in Head Start and family and community engagement services. Bachelor's or Associate's in a related field is required.

SCOPE OF WORK

• Provide consultation, coordination of services, training, and support of family and

- community engagement services for Head Start and Early Head Start programs inside the MARC Head Start network.
- Assist the Family and Community Engagement Manager and Coordinator in creating and maintaining collaborative partnerships with community partners.
- Work in collaboration with site staff to develop and implement parent committees, parent trainings, and a parent curriculum.
- Support the Family and Community Engagement Manager and Coordinator with current initiatives; Parent Advisory Committee, Parent Café, Buckle-Up Clinics, IMPACT KC, Advocacy and other community, state and national initiatives that support community engagement.

The proposed scope of work includes the following tasks:

- Work in collaboration with MARC Family and Community staff to plan Communities of Practice, Showcase for advocates and additional advocate trainings
- Provide support for advocates in timelines for completion of assessments, partnership agreements, PIR, Practice Profiles
- In collaboration with family advocate, provide resources and connections for parent education.
- In collaboration with center director and family advocate, planning for parent curriculum, fathering events, education events and parent training.
- Meet as requested in person and by phone with MARC Family and Community Engagement
 Manager and Coordinator regarding work assignments as needed.

Funding Timeframes:

- The terms of this contract will begin on 11-1-2025 and be reviewed yearly.
- The contract will extend from 11-1-2025 through 10-31-2026.
- Thereafter, MARC may extend the term of the contract for up to two additional periods. This extension is contingent upon successful performance and services provided, and upon availability of funds.
- All awards are provisional pending approval of the MARC's federal grant application by The Administration for Children and Families.
- Should a respondent's contract be terminated or relinquished for any reason, MARC reserves the right to return to the pool of respondents generated from this RFQ to select another qualified respondent.

Budget is based on an estimated 15 hours per week / 60 hours per month, these hours may fluctuate based on the time of year and schedule of activities. In some months, the hours may be more and in others, such as the summer months, the hours may be less.

Selected candidate / agency should be aware that this is a federally funded project and as such the contract will be subject to all terms and conditions applicable to federal grants. Selected candidate must also provide documentation of a clear criminal background check and TB screening.
