# Advocacy is Mission

- It is important nonprofit organizations engage in advocacy to advance their mission
- Public policy is better when informed by nonprofit advocates
- State lobbying rules do not prohibit nonprofit advocacy
- Leaders in the nonprofit sector encourage advocacy

## **National**

- BoardSource: The most effective charitable organizations recognize advocacy means using our voices as champions for our missions.
- Stand for Your Mission: Public policy impacts the work of nonprofits. Advocacy is a way to stand up for mission.
- National Council of Nonprofits: Has resources for nonprofit advocacy in action.

## Missouri Ethics Commission


- What is a lobbyist?
  - Acting in the ordinary course of business
  - Engaged in pay as a lobbyist
  - Designated as a lobbyist
  - Spends \$50 or more on public officials annually
- What is not?
  - Testifying as a witness before the general assembly
  - Appearing before a state board or commission

## **Kansas Ethics Commission**

- Who must register as a lobbyist?
  - Any person employed to a considerable degree to lobby
  - Any person formally appointed as the primary representative of an organization to lobby
  - Any person who spend \$1,000 or more a year in lobbying

## **IRS** Rule

- Organizations may involve themselves in issues of public policy without actively being considered as lobbying.
  - Such as educational activities
- No organization may qualify as a 501(c)(3) if a <u>substantial</u> part of its activities is attempting to influence legislation.
- A 501(c)(3) may engage in some lobbying, but not too much
- "Lobby" means: contacting decision-makers, about a specific piece of legislation, and asking for a vote.

### Major Budget Themes of the 2022 Session



- 1. Projected 2022 budget surplus (\$2.8 billion)
- 2. Long term financial investments
- 3. Addressing the food sales tax

Increased (pandemic) federal funding

## **Policy Changes to Provide Relief**



### Food Sales Tax (State-Level Only)

Reduction from 6.5% to 4% beginning Jan. 1, 2023

Will be fully eliminated by Jan.1, 2025



### **Employer Child Care Tax Credit**

Eligibility for \$3M credit to include small businesses



### ARPA Federal Funds Allows for Crucial One-Time Investments



\$1.5 million for senior nutrition


\$12.5 million for rural economic development

\$23.1 million for rural middle-income housing



#### **Missouri State Budget Fiscal Years 2019 - 2023**


Amounts in Billions





## Federal COVID Response Impact on Missouri Major Funding Pools



## FY2023 Budget Highlights

- ✓ Medicaid Expansion fully funded
- ✓ CDS/HCBS \$700m each
- √\$91m for Area Agencies on Aging
- √\$34m for redeterminations of Medicaid once PHE ends.
- √\$23 million for Suicide Hotline & Mobile Crisis Response Teams

### Missouri:

- Medicaid Expansion Fully Funded
- HJR 117 Defeated



### Kansas:

- SB 472 Kansas Innovative Solutions for Affordable Healthcare Act
- HB 2459 Creating the Kansas Health Act



## **Home and Community Based Services**

### Kansas:

- Senate Sub. for HB 2279 Scope of Practice -
- HB 2114 Senior Care Task Force

### Missouri:

Missouri used ARPA Funds to Increase Provider Rates and modernize IT infrastructure





## Voting Restrictions

### Missouri:

- HB 1878 Passed
  - Governor Expected to Sign
  - Court Action Expected upon Signature
  - Effective End of August post Primary

### Kansas:

- HB 2138 Enrolled Law effective July 1, 2022
- HB 2252 Modification of Election Laws





### **Consumer Utility Issues**

### Kansas:

- Winter Storm Uri KCC
- HCR 5023 Denouncing price gouging

### Missouri:

- Plant In-Service Accounting sunset extended
  - Moderate positive changes
- Construction Work In Progress (CWIP) Defeated





## **Nursing Home Reform**

### Missouri:

- Visitation Rights for Families
- Caregiver Access to Loved Ones

### Kansas:

- SB 453 Enrolled
- SB 286 COVID-19 pandemic Vetoed
- HB 2004- Involuntary discharge appeal





## **Prescription Drug Assistance**

### Missouri:

- MO Rx Sunset Extended 7 years
- No Restoration of Eligibility

### Kansas:

• HB 2721 - Sales tax exemption over-the-counter drugs.

- Senate Sub. for HB 2239 Golden Years
- HB 2106 Food Sales Tax Elimination

### Missouri:

Individual Tax Credit or "Tax Rebate"

### Senior Care Act

- 1989 SB 60 Key Provisions
- Cost Avoidance to State of Kansas
  - Comparing the FE or nursing facility state general revenue costs to the Senior Care Act costs and multiplied by the number of SCA (1,874) customers.

## **Proposed Legislation**

- Senior Care Task Force 2022 HB 2114
  - Review of Kansas programs for aging
- HB 2151 (2022)
  - Kansas elder and dependent adult abuse multidisciplinary teams and a coordinator
- HB 2543 (2022)
  - Expanding eligibility for Kansas senior care act services to include Kansas residents younger than 60 years of age
