





# WE TESTED FOUR LAND USE DEVELOPMENT SCENARIOS TO SEE THE FUTURE:


 Higher/lower than anticipated population growth rates vs. more compact/dispersed land use



#### **WHAT WE LEARNED:**

 In slow growth and high growth futures, best investment and growth strategy = focused growth with heavy multimodal investments

## LAND USE FORECAST



Our rate of growth is slowing down. Our region is also becoming older and significantly more diverse. Households will also shrink in size.

## FINANCIAL CAPACITY ANALYSIS

#### **FORECAST**

- Re-evaluate transportation funding through 2050
- Based on past and recent investment levels projected forward

#### **OUTCOMES**

- Funding sufficient for highway/roadway management, operations and limited expansion for economic development and congestion relief.
- No revenue forecasted for new transit projects or services as temporary COVID-19 federal funding ends



## PERFORMANCE-BASED PLANNING



Safety measures biggest immediate concern

Infrastructure condition measures trending positively (interstate system) but stalling or trending negatively (noninterstate)

System performance measures all on track to beat 2023 targets. We have a highly reliable roadway network with low congestion

Transportation choices reflect that most transportation system users rely on single-occupant vehicles and access to our transit system remains low

**Environment & public health measures** remain generally steady, but not making any progress

#### **BRIEF REPORT**

a.) REPORT: Update of Mid-America Regional Council federal grants and pass-through funds

#### DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE

GUSNIP Incentive and Prescription Program: The initial federal grant has ended. A \$2M grant from State of Missouri and contributions form private funders is extending the work for a few more months. The opportunity for new federal support for this program has been withdrawn.



#### **DEPARTMENT OF ENERGY**

Renew America's Nonprofits grant had been put on hold but now have direction to proceed. Meeting with DOE officers weekly.

No communication from DOE staff on the following grants:

- Building Performance Grant
- Mid-America Collaborative for Code Workforce Development and Implementation Program
- Building Performance Standard Pathway Alternatives and Training Hubs <u>Program</u>



#### **DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES**

<u>SAMHSA Mobile Crisis Response (988)</u> – a national training was cancelled. Getting ready to submit third year budget. Many staff laid off, hard to get communication.

<u>Refugee Family Child Care Microenterprise Development Program - Work</u> continues, reimbursements appear to be as normal. However, local resettlement agency partners report not receiving reimbursements from the federal government and have had to layoff team members

<u>Kansas Homeland Security Grant</u> – put on notice that reimbursements may be delayed due to additional review in order to: "ensure that funding is obligated and disbursed in line with the Secretary's direction…."



#### **DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE**

<u>DOJ Automated License Plate Readers</u> – first year program appears to be funded. Second year of license plate reader funding cancelled.

#### **ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY**

Resilient People, Resilient Places - March 12 EPA placed all EJ and DEI employees on administrative leave. We received notice of termination of the grant on Friday. The \$200,000 grant was almost spent out. We have notified our partners.



#### **OTHER UPDATES**

- Received notice to Head Start regarding the restriction of OHS funds in the furtherance of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion. Prohibits using training dollars on DEI efforts.
- New social security ID requirements may require more support to clients.
- Delay of 2025 ICAP rate
- Inventory of private funds
- Beginning 2025R and 2026 Budget process early
