 - a. Lauren Grashoff from the City of Shawnee requested approval to make a change to the middle of the trail route. Condemnation must be pursued by the City of Merriam for the original route to be maintained, and the City of Merriam will not pursue condemnation.

- b. Patrick Trouba asked if the alternate route would feature a wider path. Ms. Grashoff confirmed that Merriam is looking at making improvements to signage and ADA intersection infrastructure and potentially widening their sidewalk. Shawnee has the right-of-way to construct a 10-foot wide shared use path.
- c. Bailey Waters asked if crossings would be provided at Mastin and Melrose Sts. Ms. Grashoff confirmed that there are crossings there, but that they would look into opportunities for improvements.
- d. John Davis moved to approve the scope change request. Bailey Waters seconded the motion.

4. State TAP balances, project updates

- a. Kansas TAP balance as of 8/1/2025
 - i. Pending obligations: \$1.84 million, but Edwardsville's Towne Centre Connector project will move to FY 2026.
 - ii. Unobligated balance: \$2.59 million, to be affected by the above project moving to FY 2026.
 - iii. No additional updates from sponsors.
- b. Missouri TAP balance as of 7/8/2025
 - i. Obligations: \$382,608
 - ii. MoDOT 120% target to go: \$6.36 million.
 - iii. Unobligated balance: \$12.86 million.
 - iv. Based on anticipated obligations, the TAP program will fall short of MoDOT's 120% goal.

5. Other Business

- a. Martin Rivarola notified the committee of virtual workshops for the planning and technical committees to review MARC staff's committee restructuring recommendations. Tentative dates for the virtual workshops are Thursday, August 28 at 1:30-3pm, and Wednesday, September 3 at 1:30-3pm. The third tentative date on September 9 likely won't happen. See the attached slides for more details.
- b. Beth Dawson promoted the Vibrant Success Stories event, to be held on Friday, December 5, in which the implementation of Planning Sustainable Places (PSP) projects is highlighted and celebrated. Sponsors of previous PSP projects are invited to submit stories about projects that either have been implemented or are fully funded and in progress. Deadline for submissions is August 29.
- c. Dr. Neuberger asked if there were any developments in finding a Missouri co-chair. Patrick Trouba said that there were not, and since MARC was considering committee restructuring, that matter may be put on hold.
