Bridge Street Roundabout

The City of Smithville received funding for the construction of the Bridge Street Roundabout for Fiscal Year 2026. The construction budget includes:

Local Funding \$1,274,000

Federal Funding \$ 896,000

Total Funding \$2,170,000

Engineers estimate \$2,824,00

The City also received \$900,000, TAP -3302(449), funding for the construction of our Riverwalk for FY 2026. The current Engineer estimate is only \$600,000. At the current estimate, the maximum federal reimbursement at 80% is \$480,000.

The City of Smithville would request that \$400,000 of the funding for the Riverwalk project be reallocated to the Bridge Street Roundabout Project. This would provide \$1,296,000 federal funding for the Bridge Street Roundabout. The remaining gap will be budgeted in our 2027 budget beginning November 1, 2026. This would leave \$500,000 for the Riverwalk Project.

Both projects have R/W clearance and final PS&E for Bridge Street will be submitted June 5th and first PS&E submittal for the Riverwalk will be submitted May 1st. Both projects can be obligated this fiscal year.

Missouri Programming Committee Meeting Summary

April 2026

1. Welcome and Introductions

Missouri Programming Committee (MPC) Chair Sherri McIntyre welcomed members and guests and called the meeting to order. Online guests were asked to introduce themselves in the chat, and self-introductions for in-person attendees followed. Attendance of this meeting is included at the end of this summary.

2. Vote: March 10, 2026 Meeting Summary

Chuck Soules moved to approve the March 10, 2026 meeting summary that was included in the meeting packet. George Binger seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

3. Vote: Missouri Program Status and Obligations Report

Transportation Program Manager Marc Hansen reviewed commonly used terms and outlined the general process of project administration, and how the committee is charged with monitoring and making federal funding recommendations for transportation projects in the region. Mr. Hansen reviewed the balances, program statuses, and expected obligations for each program.

The committee discussed revenue neutral modifications requested. Kansas City noted they will request to push the Montgall Pedestrian Path project to 2027 (CRP), and Belton can advance the Markey Parkway Phase 2 project from 2027 to 2026 (STBG). Michael Park moved to approve reallocating \$909,024 from Harrisonville's S Commercial Street Extension to the M-2 Culvert over Muddy Creek (STBG program), reallocating \$82,000 from Liberty's I-35 Native Landscaping to Liberty Dr Sidewalk (TA program), and moving Independence's 23rd Street (M-78) Complete Streets - Phase 2 to 2027 (TA program). Greg Rokos seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

The committee discussed requests for additional funding. Smithville - Bridge Street Roundabout (STBG) requested an addition of \$700,000 due to increased estimates; without additional funds, the project would need to be pushed back to 2027. The committee discussed the request, status of the project, and potential alternatives to fund/help obligate the project. Jerry Kaylor moved to shift \$700,000 out of the Carbon Reduction Program to fund the Smithville Bridge Street Roundabout project. No second was provided, and the motion failed. The committee suggested utilizing revenue neutral adjustments from Smithville's other projects and discussing options with city leaders to make up the difference in funding, and asked Smithville to submit an updated request at the next committee meeting.

Other requests for additional funding were designed to help spend down balances across programs; the obligation update showed that programming additional funds would not be needed to meet obligation goals, so the committee did not approve those requests.

Wes Minder made a motion to advance the Belton - Markey Parkway Phase 2 project from 2027 to 2026. Michael Park seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

4. Missouri Unfunded Needs

Marc Hansen reviewed the Missouri Unfunded Needs list, which includes Road/Bridge projects (split into three tiers) and Multimodal projects. Proposed updates to the list include:

- Move entirety of US71 (Bruce R Watkins) safety improvement to Tier 2.
- Adjust/remove northland PEL priority segment 2 (I35 improvements from downtown loop to MO 210 due to project partially underway).
- Add I-70 SE quadrant of downtown loop safety & operation improvements.
- Adjust scope and reduce cost for I70/Lefholz Bridge interchange and move up in priority for project.

There are no proposed updates to the multimodal project list. Mr. Hansen outlined the next steps for committee and MARC Board approval. Requested revisions are due to MoDOT by June 1, 2026.

5. 2026 Suballocated Call for Projects Update

The committee received an update on Phase I of the suballocated call for projects. Anticipated funding available for all Missouri programs totals \$60.9m, and applications received totaled over \$230m. Mr. Hansen reviewed the number of applications by type, noting roadway projects were the top in both number of applications and funding amount requested. Next steps include staff assessments of Phase I applications, expected to be released by April 17. The Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) will review assessments from Phase I at their next meeting on May 6, 2026. The committee was informed of the potential of adding meetings to the schedule to accommodate programming work.

6. Other Business

Vacancies on the committee were reported. Jurisdictions needing to update their appointments should contact MARC staff.

7. Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned. The next meeting of the MPC is May 12, 2026.
