VOTE: JUNE 16, 2026 MEETING SUMMARY

1) Welcome/Introductions

Missouri Co-Chair Mayor Leonard Jones confirmed a quorum and called the meeting to order. The meeting was virtual as MARC prepares to move offices to 801 Pennsylvania, and guests were asked to introduce themselves in the chat. Attendance of this meeting is included at the end of this summary.

2) Action items

a. **Vote: May 19, 2025 Meeting Summary**

No changes were suggested for the meeting summary.

b. **Vote: 2026 Suballocated Call for Projects - Project Alignment Status**

Transportation Planning Director Martin Rivarola reviewed the outcomes of Phase I of the 2026 Suballocated Call for Projects, which assessed project applications for consistency with regional plans and policies. Applications were reviewed by staff and members of the Technical Advisory Committee (TAC), and a summary report of assessments was included in the meeting packet. Mr. Rivarola acknowledged the extensive participation of TAC members in the review process, the high rate of concurrence with staff assessments, rates for applications that were reclassified, and alignment totals overall.

c. **Vote: ConnectedKC 2050 MTP Amendment #2 - Central Avenue Bridge**

At the May TTPC meeting, the committee released the second amendment to the Metropolitan Transportation Plan (MTP) for public review and comment, and requested additional follow up regarding bicycle/pedestrian facilities on the project. The amendment adds the Central Avenue Bridge project to the MTP, which has sufficient financial capacity to include the project. Martin Rivarola confirmed that the project scope does include bicycle/pedestrian facilities, and summarized the public comments received, which were included in the meeting packet.

d. **Vote: 2026 Special amendment #2 to the 2026-2030 Transportation Improvement Program**

The second special amendment on the 2026-2030 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) was released after last month's meeting for public review and comment. Comments received were included in the meeting packet with the MTP Amendment #2 agenda item.

e. **Vote: 2026 3rd Quarter Amendment to the 2026-2030 Transportation Improvement Program**

Transportation Program Manager Marc Hansen reported on the regularly scheduled third quarter amendment to the 2026-2030 TIP, which involves additions/modifications to over sixty projects. A [map of projects](#) is available on the MARC website, with additional details available in the [amendment listing](#). MARC will continue to provide/improve visualizations of projects in future amendments.

f. Vote: Critical Urban Freight Corridors

Transportation Planner Cy Splichal reported on Critical Urban Freight Corridors (CUFCs), which were presented to the committee at last month's meeting. The Technical Advisory Committee provided recommendations of CUFCs in Kansas counties of the Kansas City urbanized area in three tiers, which were included in the meeting packet. Mr. Splichal reviewed the tiers and provided details on the sources and rationale behind the recommendations.

g. Vote: Regional Public Transportation Agency Safety Plan Performance Measure Target (PTASP)

Principal Planner Bobby Evans reviewed regional targets for safety performance measures across fixed route bus, microtransit (non-fixed route bus), and streetcar (rail). MARC coordinated with KCATA, Unified Government, Johnson County Transit, and the KC Streetcar Authority to develop consolidated regional targets across these modes, and Mr. Evans shared details on the criteria used to measure safety performance.

Committee action:

Mayor Eric Mikkelsen moved to approve agenda items 2a through 2g as presented. Councilmember Jerry Kaylor seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

VOTE: 2026 3RD QUARTER AMENDMENT TO THE 2026-2030 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM

BACKGROUND

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is the region's short-range program, identifying projects to receive federal funds and projects of regional significance to be implemented over the next three to five-year period. MARC amends the TIP on both a quarterly cycle and as needed to accommodate changes to projects in the TIP.

The proposed 2026 3rd Quarter Amendment to the 2026-2030 Transportation Improvement Program includes 62 projects:

- 37 new projects to be added, including but not limited to:
 - #590330 - MoDOT - US-169: Bridge Rehabilitation over the BNSF Railway
 - #690572 - MoDOT - US-71: Bridge rehabilitation over 12th St.
 - #990431 - MoDOT - MO 13: Upgrade signals at Main St, South St, and Walmart Ave. in Richmond
 - #990440 - MoDOT - MO 13: Bridge rehabilitation over the Missouri River in Ray County
- 25 existing projects with modifications to the scope, schedule, or budget

REPORT: SMART MOVES OUTREACH & PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT

BACKGROUND

Enhanced transit services have long been desired in the Kansas City metropolitan area to meet multiple goals for quality development and access to opportunity for area residents and businesses. In 2017, MARC and partners updated the region's Smart Moves public transportation vision plan. This plan included an integrated set of strategies and project proposals to improve transit services throughout the region.

While this plan has provided a framework for most of the region's recent high profile transit investments, the pace of implementation has been slow due to a variety of factors, particularly the lack of locally supported implementation plans and funding. Now there is a sense of urgency about public transportation in the context of rising needs and declining services in many parts of the region.

MARC has advanced an update to the Smart Moves plan with a particular focus on developing investible implementation strategies rooted in local priorities, served by a range of service types that are regionally connected. This update delivers major re-prioritized Smart Moves service recommendations, including anticipated capital and operational costs. Potential local funding mechanisms have also been identified. The work has also included a benefit cost analysis. MARC anticipates public outreach regarding the outcomes of this work in the late summer/early fall of 2026. Staff will provide an overview of the status of the engagement and public outreach plan

REPORT: HOUSING & TRANSPORTATION COORDINATION PLAN

BACKGROUND

Following the addition of housing specific goals to the metropolitan transportation plan (MTP) Connected KC 2050, the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) has begun work on a Regional Housing and Transportation Coordination Plan. This study will offer a thorough, data-driven approach to better integrating transportation, housing, and economic development within MARC's planning efforts. It will analyze current conditions, regional challenges, and future opportunities to better integrate the region's housing network and transportation system.

MARC staff will present on the following tasks that are currently underway:

- Approach to geospatial, economic, and policy analysis
- Engagement with key stakeholders

Staff will also present on MARC's existing housing program including the Regional Housing Partnership, an initiative in partnership with LISC KC dedicated to building a strong, connected housing system across the MARC region.

The Housing and Transportation Coordination Plan seeks to strengthen MARC's work as a metropolitan planning organization, as well as support the goals of MARC's housing program and regional partners.

Work on this plan began in April 2026 and will continue through Spring 2027. Oversight includes a Housing and Transportation Advisory Committee, MARC's transportation policy committees, and the Regional Housing Partnership's Coordinating Council.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

The 2021 federal Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA) allows the creation of "housing coordination plans" that could be associated with required short- and long-term transportation plans. This is only an eligible activity for MPOs representing Transportation Management Areas (TMAs), which are those with populations over 200,000.

REPORT: TRANSPORTATION RESILIENCY KC - PHASE 2 PLANNING

BACKGROUND

MARC is initiating Phase 2 of the Transportation Resiliency KC study to strengthen the region's ability to withstand and recover from increasingly frequent and severe natural hazards. The Kansas City region has experienced growing risks from flooding, drought, extreme heat and other weather-related events that threaten transportation infrastructure, disrupt mobility and impact public safety and the economy.

[Phase 1](#) of this effort established a foundational framework, including stakeholder engagement, initial risk concepts and a preliminary screening and prioritization approach. Phase 2 will build on that work by advancing a more detailed, data-driven assessment of the region's multimodal transportation system.

The primary goal of this study is to develop a comprehensive regional transportation resilience improvement plan (TRIP). This includes assessing risks under current and future extreme weather conditions, identifying vulnerable transportation assets and evaluating the economic, operational and social consequences of disruptions.

A key component of the study is the development of analytical tools and decision-support resources that enable MARC and its regional partners to better understand risks and prioritize investments. The plan will provide actionable recommendations for infrastructure improvements, emergency preparedness and long-term strategies that can be integrated into existing planning processes such as the Transportation Improvement Program, Connected KC 2050 and local planning initiatives.

Ultimately, this effort aims to guide strategic investments and policy decisions that enhance long-term resilience across the Kansas City transportation system.

This planning effort will kick-off in July with High Street Consulting and ICF. Interested members of the committee are encouraged to [sign up](#) for project updates that will be sent over the course of the 12-month project schedule.

POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

This effort advances Connected KC and the Kansas City Regional Climate Action Plan by integrating extreme weather impacts into transportation planning, identifying vulnerable assets and prioritizing investment to further support informed funding decisions and implementation of strategies that address flooding, heat and other extreme weather impacts on the regional transportation system.

BUDGET CONSIDERATIONS

The cost of the project is \$450,000. This funding is sourced from Kansas PROTECT funding, MARC planning funds and transportation reserves.
