Authorize grant application to the Sunflower Foundation Kansas Fights Addiction program to support justice-involved community health worker training and workforce development.

The Mid-America Regional Council Community Services Corporation (MARC CSC) has supported efforts to advance the Community Health Worker (CHW) workforce in Kansas and Missouri since 2016. This proposed program would enable MARC to build on the foundation established under KDHE's Beyond Walls: Community Health Worker (CHW) Certification Training During Incarceration initiative in Kansas jurisdictions.

Authorize grant application to the Kansas Health Foundation Upward Mobility program to support justice-involved community health worker training and workforce development.

The proposed program would enable MARC to build on the foundation established under KDHE's Beyond Walls: Community Health Worker (CHW) Certification Training During Incarceration initiative. The program is intended to build capacity within

correctional facilities to deliver training, develop career paths and help justice-involved individuals gain marketable skills for meaningful employment that offers a livable wage upon reentry.

Authorize grant application to the Health Forward Foundation to support CHW training and workforce development.

The Health Forward Foundation has provided support to the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) Community Services Corporation (CSC) for its work to convene the KC Regional CHW Collaborative, promote the CHW profession and encourage employment of CHWs, provide information and training on reimbursement of CHW services through Kansas Medicaid and Medicare, and integrate CHWs in diverse settings working collaboratively with other roles such as community paramedics in the community.

Councilmember Holly Grummert motioned to approve and Commissioner Janeé Hanzlick seconded.

REPORT: Review of 2025 MARC CSC Internal Revenue Service Form 990: Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax

BACKGROUND

The Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) Community Services Corporation (CSC) is formed as a 501(c)(3) organization and is required to file Form 990: Return of Organization Exempt from Income Tax each for each fiscal year (January 1st to December 31st) with the IRS. A draft Form 990 is provided to the MARC Board of Directors before being filed. The 2025 Form 990 highlights include \$3.3M of revenues, \$3.9M of expenses, and an ending fund balance of \$16K.

The 2025 Form 990 is prepared with the assistance of MARC's engaged public accountants, RubinBrown LLP. The Draft Form 990 is available for review on the MARC website at:

BUDGET CONSIDERATIONS

The Board approved the agreement with Rubin Brown for continuation of Audit Services at the January 2026 board meeting. The estimated cost for the 2025 audits is \$89,000. Funds for the audit are budgeted in the Indirect Costs Fund in the 2026 Budget.

Healthy Environment

VOTE: Authorize contracts with 11 nonprofit organizations and a construction project management firm to support the US Department of Energy's Renew America's Nonprofits Grant Program.

BACKGROUND:

In May 2024, the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) Community Service Corporation (CSC) Board authorized acceptance of a grant from the US Department of Energy, Renew America's Nonprofits, in the amount of \$4,734,755. The grant was matched with \$1.5 million in private funds from four area foundations.

In June and August 2026, the MARC Budget and Personnel Committee and MARC Board heard a report on the status of the US Department of Energy Renew America's Nonprofits grant program and authorized agreements with selected nonprofit organizations for energy improvements to their buildings. The June agenda report included modest funds for a construction project management firm to support MARC in working with the 28 selected nonprofit organizations.

In early August, the Department of Energy approved MARC's request to move the project forward to construction, starting with the first 11 buildings. MARC issued a Request for Qualifications and selected Sustainable Investment Group, LLC, a subsidiary of TUV SUD America Inc., to support the work. Given the number of nonprofit organizations that will require project management support and the retirement of MARC personnel, the revised budget approved by the Department of Energy includes up to \$235,000 for this project management contractor to support the program through mid-2028.

The program implementation will begin with 11 nonprofit buildings needing work on HVAC replacements and controls, LED lighting, building envelope sealing and other repairs. The MARC CSC board is asked to approve the amounts authorized by the MARC Board for each of the first 11 nonprofit buildings and the construction project manager agreement.
