Missouri Programming Committee Meeting Summary

August 2026

1. Welcome and Introductions

Missouri Programming Committee (MPC) Chair Sherri McIntyre welcomed members and guests and called the meeting to order. Attendance of this meeting is included at the end of this summary.

2. VOTE: July 14, 2026, Meeting Summary

Councilmember Jerry Kaylor moved to approve the July 14, 2026 and meeting summary. Tom Degenhardt seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

3. VOTE: Missouri Program Status and Obligations Report

Transportation Programs Manager Marc Hansen reviewed existing projects and their obligation status by funding program.

The Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) program has obligated most projects, with the KCMO - Vivion Corridor Improvements (\$300,000 CMAQ and \$975,000 in Transportation Alternatives, "TA") and Lee's Summit Intersection of Ward Road and Persels Road (\$1.25m) projects left to obligate. Lee's Summit reported that they are making progress and expect to obligate this year.

The Carbon Reduction Program (CRP) has nearly \$5m in projects on the 2026 program. The Liberty Drive Sidewalk/Trail Missing Link Connection is the only CRP project that has obligated (\$250,000 in CRP funds, and \$82,000 in TA funds). The remaining projects are making progress.

The Surface Transportation Block Grant (STBG) program has obligated just over \$1m, with \$26m on the program. Harrisonville - M-2 Culvert over Muddy Creek (\$1.9m), Riverside - Riverway Boulevard Improvements (\$2.56m), Gladstone - Downtown Gladstone North Oak Complete Street (\$4.39m), Smithville - Bridge Street Roundabout (\$896,000 STBG, \$400,000 TA) are expected to obligate this year. Platte City - M-92 Capacity & Safety Improvements (\$4.25m), Independence - Winner Road Complete Streets - US 24 to Hedges (\$5.52m), and Belton - Markey Parkway Phase 2 (\$5m) have requested conditional clearance, and ability to obligate this year is yet to be determined.

The Transportation Alternatives (TA) program has obligated almost \$3m of the \$7.5m on the program. The MO 291: bridge rehabilitation and add pedestrian facilities over the Missouri River (\$1m) has obligated. Smithville - Bridge Street Roundabout (listed above), Smithville - Riverwalk Park - Phase 1 (\$500,000), and Smithville - Second Creek Sidewalk (\$600,000) are expected to obligate this year. Kansas City - Paseo Boulevard Bikeways (\$1.16m) and Kansas City - Vivion Corridor Improvements (\$975,000 TA, \$300,000 CMAQ) are yet to obligate. Parkville - Bell Road Pedestrian Improvements (\$750,000) will not make obligation in 2026.

As of this meeting, 15% of allocated funds have been obligated. Without further obligations in 2026, MARC would lose control of \$32,920,678.

4. 2026 Suballocated Call for Projects Update

Marc Hansen reviewed summary information on sub-allocated funding applications; MARC received 83 individual applications, with 115 different funding applications (some projects requested funding from multiple sources). In Missouri, MARC received 50 individual applications and 2 regional applications, totaling nearly \$200m in requests.

Mr. Hansen shared details on the distribution of applications by project type and county. MARC staff will score projects and allow applicants opportunity to question or request reconsideration of scores (but any information not included in the original application cannot be considered to improve a score). The committee discussed the programming process and timeline.

Sabin Yanez moved to allow three minutes per jurisdiction for project presentations. Sabin Yanez amended the motion to limit presentations to three slides per presentation. Councilmember Jerry Kaylor seconded the motion to allow three minutes and three slides per jurisdiction. The motion passed.

Presentation slides should be submitted to MARC staff by 5pm September 1.

5. Public Participation Plan Update

Transportation Planner Cy Splichal briefed the committee on the update to MARC's Public Participation Plan. Mr. Splichal identified challenges and opportunities to community engagement, and explained some of the federal requirements MARC must meet for its core transportation planning products. MARC's update of the plan also seeks to reframe and reassess how we use community engagement to make projects better and impact decision-

making. Mr. Splichal invited committee members to [complete a survey](#) to share feedback on how community engagement impacts their work on the MARC committees they serve.

6. Other Business

The committee thanked MoDOT for hosting the meeting.

The Regional Bridge Program application is open. Funds will be awarded in FFY 2027; funding amounts are unknown, but expected to be similar to FFY 2026. The application is available on the [MoDOT website](#). Applications are due by September 30, 2026.

The public meeting for the Kansas City urban Missouri Unfunded Needs list will be held early September.

7. Adjournment

The meeting was adjourned. The next meeting of the MPC is September 8, 2026, and will be held at MARC's new office at 801 Pennsylvania.
