## VOTE: JULY 21, 2026 MEETING SUMMARY

### 1) Welcome/Introductions

Kansas Co-Chair Mayor Eric Mikkelson confirmed a quorum and called the meeting to order. The meeting was virtual as MARC prepares to move offices to 801 Pennsylvania, and guests were asked to introduce themselves in the chat. Attendance of this meeting is included at the end of this summary.

### 2) Action items

#### a. **Vote: July 21, 2026 Meeting Summary**

No changes were suggested for the meeting summary.

#### b. **Vote: 2026 3rd Quarter Amendment to the 2026-2030 Transportation Improvement Program**

Transportation Program Manager Marc Hansen briefly reviewed the regularly scheduled third quarter amendment to the 2026-2030 TIP, which involves additions/modifications to over sixty projects. No comments were received during the public review and comment period.

#### Committee action:

Mike McDonough moved to approve agenda items 2a through 2b as presented. John Smedley seconded the motion, and the motion passed.

### 3) Reports

#### a. **Report: Smart Moves Outreach & Public Engagement**

Transportation Planner Lukas Yanni briefly reviewed the updates to Smart Moves (which were presented to TTPC earlier this year), and provided an overview of the status of the engagement and public outreach plan. Public engagement efforts will be tailored to two populations: the general public, and local elected officials and businesses. The aim of the outreach plan is to educate stakeholders about the plan update and benefits of transit, and does not explicitly endorse a specific funding scenario or approach. A [survey](#) is available to share feedback, and committee members discussed how the World Cup drew increased usage and attention to regional transit, giving positive momentum to public engagement efforts. A separate study, the Travel Patterns After Action Assessment, will specifically focus on changes in travel patterns (including but not limited to transit) surrounding World Cup events.

#### b. **Report: Housing & Transportation Coordination Plan**

Transportation Planner Cy Splichal and Regional Housing Program Manager Hannah Mitchell reviewed the planning efforts in response to Connected KC 2050's housing goals. The Regional Housing and Transportation Coordination Plan will align housing and transportation goals, coordinate with existing housing plans and partnerships, develop strategies and technical resources, and engage the community. The

presenters reviewed the work of the Greater Kansas City Regional Housing Partnership (RHP), the spectrum of housing across communities, and plans to analyze existing conditions. Work on the plan will continue through Spring 2027, and those interested in opportunities for participating in public engagement efforts can submit a [contact form](#).

**c. Report: Transportation Resiliency KC - Phase 2 Planning**

Air and Mobility Programs Manager Karen Clawson reviewed the data-driven assessment of the region's transportation system in relation to current and future extreme weather conditions. The plan will provide resources for the region to understand risks and prioritize investments in infrastructure, vulnerable assets, emergency preparedness, and long-term resiliency. Strategies resulting from the plan will be integrated into the Metropolitan Transportation Plan. Phase 2 kicks off in July and will be led by a steering committee and owners & asset managers work group, and committee members were invited to sign up for project updates on the [MARC website](#).

The August TTPC meeting is canceled; the next TTPC meeting will be held Tuesday, September 15 at the new MARC offices at 801 Pennsylvania.

### VOTE: APPROVE PLANNING SUSTAINABLE PLACES 2027 FUNDING RECOMMENDATIONS

#### BACKGROUND

The Kansas City region's vibrant, green and connected centers and corridors are central to the [Creating Sustainable Places](#) initiative, and the region's long-range transportation plan, [Connected KC 2050](#).

In 2012, MARC's Total Transportation Policy Committee (TTPC) and the Creating Sustainable Places (CSP) Coordinating Committee launched [Planning Sustainable Places](#) (PSP), a combined initiative to provide communities with planning resources to advance sustainable projects in their corridors and centers.

MARC issued the eighth PSP call projects on May 4, 2026 and it closed on June 22, 2026. MARC Staff conducted an initial review and scoring of the 28 applications and worked with the Sustainable Places Policy Committee (SPPC) to develop a recommended funding list. The SPPC approved the final recommendation list on September 11, 2026. The recommended list will be available on the [PSP webpage](#) after the SPPC meeting.

The specifics of the recommendation will be presented at the TTPC September meeting.

PSP is a supporting program of the region's long-range transportation plan, Connected KC 2050.

### **VOTE: 2026 SUBALLOCATED CALL FOR PROJECTS - UPDATED PHASE 1 PROJECT ASSESSMENTS**

#### **BACKGROUND**

One of MARC's fundamental roles as Metropolitan Planning Organization is to facilitate processes for cooperative decision-making about the use of federal transportation dollars for projects and programs in the Kansas City area. A 'phase 1' call for projects for the Carbon Reduction Program (CRP), Congestion Mitigation Air Quality (CMAQ) program, Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBG) and Surface Transportation Block Grant Program - Set Aside Program (TAP) programs [was launched](#) and closed on March 20, 2026. A subsequent technical (phase 2) application was launched and closed on July 31, 2026.

MARC conducted the 2026 call for projects in two phases. The first phase assessed project applications for consistency with regional plans and policies. The second phase is currently evaluating project applications using the scoring methodologies established by the various programming committees. The Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) and TTPC previously reviewed and approved Phase 1 project evaluation/assessments. Upon conclusion of the committee evaluation projects, distribution of projects in terms of alignment with the Connected KC 2050 plan were as follows:

- Highly Aligned projects: 30
- Aligned projects: 56
- Not Aligned projects: 15

In addition, the review process provided technical tips and project improvement recommendations to project sponsors. Through the subsequent Phase 2 technical application process, project sponsors were allowed the opportunity to address issues raised in the initial phase.

A number of projects provided have addressed issues raised through this process. Based on updated information provided during the phase 2 process, staff will seek concurrence from TTPC regarding these updated project assessments.

#### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS**

It is the policy of the Mid-America Regional Council to award suballocated federal transportation funding to eligible projects that advance regional goals, objectives, strategies and actions as articulated in [Connected KC 2050](#), the metropolitan transportation plan for the Kansas City region.

#### **BUDGET CONSIDERATIONS**

Preliminary funding amounts for the two-year period of FFY 2029-2030 were noted in staff report to TAC/TTPC in June 2026.

## **VOTE: 2026 4TH QUARTER AMENDMENT TO THE 2026-2030 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM**

### **BACKGROUND**

The Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) is the region's short-range program, identifying projects to receive federal funds and projects of regional significance to be implemented over the next three to five-year period. MARC amends the TIP on both a quarterly cycle and as needed to accommodate changes to projects in the TIP.

The proposed 2026 4<sup>th</sup> Quarter Amendment to the 2026-2030 Transportation Improvement Program includes 24 projects:

- 17 new projects to be added, including but not limited to:
  - #162008 - Lansing - Lansing Side Path & Main Street Crosswalk
  - #259219 - Unified Government - Bridge Network Prioritization Program
  - #280225 - KDOT - US-69 pavement replacement in Wyandotte County
  - #341005 - DeSoto - Sunflower Road Shared-Use Path Missing Link
  - #380269 - KDOT - I-35 and US-56/W 175th Street Interchange in Gardner
- 7 existing projects with modifications to the scope, schedule, or budget

## **REPORT: IMPROVE I-70 KANSAS CITY PROJECT UPDATE**

### **BACKGROUND**

Provide a brief history and description of the issue

### **POLICY CONSIDERATIONS**

The Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) is currently reconstructing, widening and realigning I-70 from Paseo Boulevard to 31st St/US-40 in Kansas City, Missouri through the Improve I-70 Kansas City design build project. Due to extensive bridge work needed in both directions, and the excessive travel delays and extended construction schedule that would be required if that work were to be conducted under traffic, MoDOT is planning to close this segment of I-70 for 11 months beginning in January, 2027.

MoDOT staff will report on the project and on efforts to mitigate travel disruptions that will occur with this extended closure. MARC's Operation Green Light and Way To Go program staff have met with the MoDOT team and will aim to support traffic signal operations and regional traveler information during the closure.

### REPORT: PUBLIC PARTICIPATION PLAN UPDATE

#### BACKGROUND

The Public Participation Plan (PPP) guides the public engagement processes and activities of the Mid-America Regional Council's Transportation and Environment Department. The PPP provides a framework that guides public involvement in transportation planning projects; and specifies goals, strategies, and techniques that encourage successful public participation.

MARC staff have been developing an update of the plan over the course of 2026. This update process included internal workshopping and engagement, external engagement, and a peer review of participation methods utilized by other metropolitan planning organizations.

This process also overlapped with an internal effort to improve community engagement practices, funded by a grant through the Health Forward Foundation. This process focused on capacity building for MARC staff to identify best practices, goals, and strategies to improve community engagement across the agency. Outcomes and deliverables from that effort will be integrated into the updated plan.

Key updates included in this iteration of the PPP include updated guidance on:

- Using social media for engagement
- Engaging committees
- Utilizing consulting firms for engagement
- Coordinating annual engagement workplans

MARC staff will present more information about the plan update including feedback received from engagement activities. The PPP is due for approval by MARC's Board of Directors by December 2026. The Technical Advisory Committee will review a draft version of the plan at their October meeting. The TTPC will then review the plan and consider releasing it for a required 45-day public comment period at their October meeting.

#### POLICY CONSIDERATIONS

In accordance with 23 CFR 450.316, MPOs must create a Public Participation Plan that establishes requirements for engagement around core MPO products. Under this requirement, MPOs must allow for:

- adequate public notice of public participation activities;
- review and comment at key decision points in the development of the MTP and TIP;
- and multiple, accessible participation formats, including electronic and in-person.

## **REPORT: 2026 SUBALLOCATED FUNDING REPORT**

### **BACKGROUND**

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) provides an opportunity each year to increase the spending authority to state departments of transportation known as the August redistribution. Through this process, funding from states unable to use their share of federal highway funding is redistributed to those states that have demonstrated an ability to use more funding. This helps to ensure that all funding authorized each year is utilized.

Timely delivery of the projects prioritized by MARC for the suballocated federal Carbon Reduction Program (CRP), Congestion Mitigation/Air Quality Program (CMAQ), Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STBG), and Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP), each year has a direct impact on the ability of the states to access additional funding through the August Redistribution process. MARC staff will brief the committee on MARC's efforts to meet the goals set by our state partners and the current status of MARC funding programs.

### REPORT: E-MOBILITY MODEL POLICY

#### BACKGROUND

The Johnson County Department of Health and Environment (JCDHE) and the Mid-America Regional Council (MARC) partnered to host workshops for cities and other community partners in the region to develop model e-mobility policy.

The initial convening in January 2026 highlighted the need for consistent policy throughout the region that improved safety and was easy for the public to understand. Representatives from local municipalities have provided feedback multiple times to shape the final version of model policy.

Highlights of e-mobility model policy include:

- Clear definitions that distinguish between e-bikes, electric motorbikes ("e-motos") and micromobility devices such as e-scooters.
- Specific regulations about where different devices can safely be operated.
- Helmet requirements for minors.
- Speed limits for sidewalks, bike lanes and trails.
- Due consideration rules such as yielding the right of way to pedestrians.
- Age restrictions for certain devices.
- One version of the policy for Kansas and another for Missouri, designed to be added to their existing model traffic ordinances.

A key goal of this model policy effort is that regulations on e-mobility devices will be consistent across the region. The policy text is available on the MARC website [on the page dedicated to e-mobility devices in the Kansas City metro](#).
